Re: Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear National Freedom of Information Officer:

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552, and applicable Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA" or "the Agency") regulations, 40 C.F.R. §§ 2.100–2.406, Environmental Defense Fund ("EDF") respectfully requests copies of certain EPA records, as that term is described at 5 U.S.C. § 552(f)(2) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). Specifically, EDF requests copies of records generated, received or transmitted beginning on October 1, 2018 up through and including the date that you conduct your search for records. EDF requests all correspondence<sup>1</sup> that addresses the topics described below and is between any EPA personnel in:

- the Office of Chemical Safety and Pollution Prevention, including but not limited to Lynn Dekleva and Eric Baptist;
- the Office of the Administrator;
- the Office of General Counsel; or
- the Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance.

and any the following External Parties:

<u>Topics</u>: EDF requests all correspondence between any EPA personnel identified above and any of the External Parties identified above, regarding the following topics:

- concerns about, or the need for revisions of, the agency's language typically used in Orders issued under section 5(e) or section 5(f) of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), including but not limited to the "boilerplate" language on EPA's website<sup>2</sup> via a link titled "EPA Previous Version TSCA Section 5 Orders boilerplate (PDF) (78 pp, 279 K, September 12, 2016);
- revisions proposed or made to the agency's language typically used in Orders issued under TSCA section 5(e) or section 5(f), including but not limited to the "boilerplate" language EPA posted to its website<sup>3</sup> on or about April 21, 2020 via a link titled "Updated version TSCA Section 5 Order for a New Chemical Substance (PDF) (77 pp, 546 K, April 21, 2020)," or any prior outlines, drafts, or versions of this document;
- solicitations by the EPA personnel of comments on the above-identified language from any of the External Parties;
- requests from any of the External Parties to the EPA personnel for an opportunity to discuss or provide comments on the above-identified language;
- comments submitted by or otherwise received by EPA from any of the External Parties pertaining to the above-identified language; or
- responses to such comments, or other communications between with any of the External Parties and the EPA personnel relating to such comments.

In any response to this request, please indicate the date the search was conducted. We request that the date of the search be as close as possible to the date of EPA's final response to this FOIA request.

## Request for Fee Waiver

As a non-partisan, non-profit organization that provides information that is in the public interest, EDF respectfully requests a waiver of fees associated with this request. We are not seeking information for any commercial purpose and the records received will contribute to a greater public understanding of issues of considerable public interest: communications between EPA personnel and members of the regulated community or their representatives (trade associations, law firms) regarding agency policies directly affecting them. More specifically, the public has shown great interest in understanding how EPA officials have complied with ethics requirements and what outside interests might be influencing EPA's decision-making on important policy matters.<sup>4</sup> Especially in regards to EPA's implementation of the recently amended Toxic Substances Control Act, the public has been greatly concerned with the officials with ties to industry who have been nominated and appointed to implement the law and protect human health and the environment against dangerous chemicals.<sup>5</sup>

EDF is well-positioned to disseminate the records to the public, as we engage in extensive, daily efforts to inform the public about matters involving environmental policy through press releases, action alerts, reports, analyses, blogs, and other public outreach materials. EDF has also published a number of blogs detailing potential conflicts of interests at EPA, including blogs that relied on materials released through FOIA. Moreover, in addition to its own capacity to convey

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information to the public, EDF shares important data with journalists to help enhance public knowledge. We fully intend to disseminate newsworthy information received in response to this request. In particular, the documents requested would shed light on potential conflicts of interest in its chemical program. The release of these documents would also significantly enhance the public's understanding of how outside interests are influencing EPA's decisions under the Toxic Substances Control Act.

Accordingly, we respectfully request that the documents be furnished without charge. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii).

For ease of administration and to conserve resources, we will accept documents produced in a readily accessible electronic format. **Please provide records on a rolling basis**; EPA's search for, or deliberations concerning, certain records should not delay the production of others that EPA has already retrieved and elected to produce.
